### Age uk

Age UK Calderdale & Kirklees Health and Community Services team are working with 'Good Neighbour Scheme'. They aim to alleviate a lot of the problems associated with later life.

A project which the people of Heptonstall are likely to hear a lot more about is 'LOCAL LINK'.

Local Link is managed by Andrew Fearnley, who has a network of Community Volunteers, mainly in rural areas of Calderdale, who act as 'eyes and ears' of their local communities, to support isolated older people. Mary Cockcroft and Jean Leach are our volunteers in the Heptonstall area.

Andrew also runs a scheme called 'SAFE & WARM', offering Home Energy Information and Advice, with support in applying for grants and reducing fuel poverty amongst vulnerable older people.

The 'ACTIVE BEFRIENDING PROJECT', coordinated by Christine Henry offers 'one to one' support for isolated people throughout Calderdale. Trained volunteers are linked with lonely older people who feel depressed and socially isolated. The scheme is focused on engaging people in activities with their befriender, in order to restore confidence and gain more out of life.

People are referred to the scheme through various channels; usually by Health Professionals, but often by family or neighbours and sometimes by the person who actually needs the support.

Since I last wrote your Council has again been actively involved in many local as well as other 'big' topics. Here's an updated summary:

Another item I shall address separately is the need for better signage of points of interest for visitors.

Often, having parked at the Bowling Club car park, visitors are uncertain as to where to go to view some of our hidden gems. As a Diamond Jubilee project the Parish Council is funding some new signage. Not quite ready yet, but I am sure the changes and additions will be a lasting improvement.

A major administrative change you may be interested in is the adoption of a new Code of Conduct which came into play on 1 October.

We have had codes of conduct for members before, but the Localism Act of 2011 brought about changes and provided more flexibility.

There are high levels of expectation for persons serving in public life and, despite your council members do not earn a penny from their busy workloads, they have to declare their Pecuniary as well as other Interests. In addition they must abide by a code which is consistent with the seven 'Nolan' principles in public life which are:

- (a) Selflessness
- (b) Integrity
- (c) Objectivity
- (d) Accountability
- (e) Openness
- (f) Honesty
- (g) Leadership

### St Thomas' Bells

As reported in the August newsletter, it has been a busy three months in the bell tower at St Thomas' church.

At the end of August the 8 bells were removed from the tower and transported to the bellfoundry of John Taylor & Co in Loughborough. While necessary refurbishment work was being carried out to the bells the local ringers and helpers embarked on the task of cleaning down and re-painting the bell frame. All the work was completed in line with the timescales set and the bells were returned to the village on Monday 1 October. Rehanging them in the tower was a slightly more difficult proposition than their removal had been, but the job was completed by Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> and the bells rang out that evening in a brief 'try-out'. All were agreed that the bellfounders had done an excellent job and regular ringing has now resumed.

When the bells were originally delivered to the tower in 1912 the occasion was recorded with a photograph of the vicar, churchwardens, local ringers and bellhanger (also from John Taylor & Co) outside the church with the bells. One hundred years on the opportunity was taken to re-create the 1912 photograph. Rev Howard Pask was in attendance as the bells arrived back, but unfortunately had to leave to take a funeral service before they had all been unloaded from the lorry. He was however represented in the photograph by churchwarden, Graham Kidd, who had been closely involved with the project throughout. Funds to cover the total cost of the works have been raised by the ringers and, including a discount for the local labour and assistance provided, the original target of £20,000 is now close to being met. We are very grateful to all those parishioners who have made donations or offered other help and support.

A service of re-dedication will take place in St Thomas' on Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> November at 7pm, led by the Bishop of Wakefield. This will be the exact centenary of the original dedication.

We hope that bells will continue to be an important part of life in the village as they have been for the last 100 years, but, to ensure that this happens, we are always keen to welcome new recruits. Anyone interested in learning to ring and joining our team should contact me and I will be pleased to "show you the ropes".
